NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, dated the 30th March, 2017

S.O.....(E) – Whereas, the Department of Heavy Industry notified the scheme namely FAME-India (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid &) Electric Vehicles in India) vide S.O.830 (E) dated 13th March, 2015.

2. And whereas, Clause 4, of the FAME India Scheme states “The Phase-1 of the scheme shall be implemented over a 2 year period i.e. FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17 commencing from 1st April 2015.”

3. And Whereas, Clause 10, of the FAME India scheme states “Mild Hybrid, Strong Hybrid, Plug-in Hybrid and Pure Electric technologies (collectively termed as xEV) are covered under the scheme.”

4. Now with the approval of competent authority, it is decided that Phase-I of the FAME-India Scheme is further extended for a further period of six months i.e. up to 30th September 2017 or till approval of Phase-II, whichever is earlier. Further “Mild Hybrid” technology as mentioned under clause 10 as stated above, will stand excluded from benefits under the FAME India Scheme w.e.f 1st April 2017. This will apply *mutatis mutandis* to other clauses in the gazette notification, which hitherto had enabled giving of demand incentives to Mild Hybrid Vehicles. Sales of mild hybrid vehicles by dealer to retail purchasers effected up to 31st March 2017 will not be affected by this amendment.

5. Therefore, FAME-India (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid &) Electric Vehicles in India) scheme notification vide S.O.830 (E) dated 13th March 2015 stands amended accordingly.
